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## Why Use Sign Language?

- American Sign Language or ASL has six great benefits:

1. Because it's Practical: less fussing and more fun.
a. Young deaf children communicate non-verbally and they sometimes become frustrated, leading to tantrums and meltdowns. When Santa communicates with them on their level it often calms them down, encourages and reassures them that they are safe.
b. This makes for a much more positive and memorable experience for both the child and the parents.
2. It Is All Around Us
a. The deaf community is very large. Because silence is the language they speak, it can go unnoticed by the hearing. As Santa you must expect that you will eventually encounter a child who signs. By signing to a deaf child you are speaking to their heart in their language. And when you do, notice how their face brightens, and their eyes light up?
3. It's Easy to Learn
a. Sign language is easy to learn because it uses so many commonplace gestures.
4. It Allows Silence
a. This can be especially helpful with autistic children who are easily disturbed by loud noises.

## 5. It's Exceedingly Useful

a. Sign language can be the most used language you learn.
b. Ever needed to communicate to someone in a crowded room without shouting? Use sign language. Lose your voice? Use sign language. On the phone and need to communicate to someone in the room without breaking your conversation? Use sign language.

## 6. It's Beautiful

a. Just watch a person use sign language. it looks like a work of art, like a graceful and beautiful ballet performance.
